for Underserved Communities Act would provide payment parity for telehealth services provided to Medicare beneficiaries at rural health clinics (RHCs) and Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) during the COVID-19 pandemic. This would fix an unintentional problem created in the CARES Act that will force most RHCs and all FQHCs to owe money back to Medicare in July for every telehealth service provided during the public health emergency.

"The benefits of telehealth in terms of protecting patients from the threat of infection during on-site visits, as well as economically have been proven during this terrible pandemic. We cannot add new cost demands and bureaucratic complications that threaten these achievements," said Hyde-Smith. "This legislation will help ensure that telehealth is available to seniors in underserved communities as we battle our way through the coronavirus threat."

"Telehealth is a lifeline for older Americans - particularly in rural communities - and in light of the coronavirus pandemic, this importance and utilization of this technology is only growing," said King. "That's why it is so critical that we adjust federal policies to help this vital medical tool continue to support the health of the American people. This legislation will offer major economic relief for healthcare providers who are following
