3 dashes Picapeppa sauce Garlic salt to taste 6 chopped green onions ½ cup chopped pecans 2 (8 oz.) block cream cheese, softened 1/3 cup chopped

jalapeno peppers Prepared pimiento cheese Line a loaf pan with Saran Wrap. In a bowl, mix together the sharp cheese, mayonnaise, Worcestershire, Picapeppa, garlic salt, green onion, and pecans; press into bottom of loaf pan. Then mix cream cheese and jalapeno peppers, and press on top of first layer. Then make a third layer by pressing pimiento cheese on top. Chill overnight and turn onto a serving platter to serve. Top with strawberry preserves or pepper jelly. Serve with Club crackers.
