"NOTICE OF A PUBLIC BUDGET HEARING ON THE PROPOSED BUDGET AND PROPOSED TAX LEVIES FOR THE UPCOMING FISCAL YEAR FOR THE CITY OF LEXINGTON"

The City of Lexington will hold a public hearing on its proposed budget and proposed tax levies for the fiscal year 2021 on Monday August 17, 5:30 p.m., at the City Hall located at 112 Spring Street, Lexington, MS.

The City of Lexington is now operating with projected total budget revenue of \$1,118,725. \$360,000, or 32.18% of such revenue is obtained through Ad Valorem Taxes. For the next fiscal year, the proposed budget has total projected revenue of \$ 1,115,021. Of that amount, 32.29% or \$360,000 is to be financed through a total ad valorem tax levy.

The decision to not increase the ad valorem tax millage rate for the fiscal year 2021 above the current fiscal year's ad valorem tax millage rate means you will not pay more in ad valorem taxes on your home, automobile, tag, utilities, business fixtures and equipment and rental real property, unless the assessed value of your property has increased for the fiscal year 2021.

A millage rate of 52.75 will produce the same amount of revenue from ad valorem taxes as was collected the prior year. The millage rate for the prior year was 52.75.

Any citizen of the City of Lexington is invited to attend this public hearing on the proposed budget and tax levies for the fiscal year 2021 and will be allowed to speak for a reasonable amount of time and offer tangible evidence before any vote is taken.
