"NOTICE OF A TAX INCREASE AND A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED **BUDGET AND PROPOSED TAX LEVIES FOR** THE TOWN OF PICKENS"

The Town of Pickens will hold a public hearing on its proposed budget and proposed tax levies for the fiscal year 2021 on September 8, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. at the Town Hall located at 163 N. Second St. in Pickens.

The Town of Pickens is now operating with projected total budget revenue of \$881,749.00. 20.60% or \$181,499.00 of such revenue is obtained through ad valorem taxes. For the next fiscal year, the proposed budget has total projected revenue of \$677,000.00 of that amount, 26.5 or \$179,600.00, is proposed to be financed through a total ad valorem tax levy.

For the next fiscal year, the Town of Pickens plans to increase your ad valorem tax millage rate by 3 mills from 37.45 mills to 38.57 mills. This increase means that you will pay more in ad valorem taxes on your home, automobile tag, utilities, business fixtures and equipment and rental real property.

Any citizen of the Town of Pickens is invited to attend this public hearing on the proposed ad valorem tax increase, and will be allowed to speak for a reasonable amount of time and offer tangible evidence before any vote is taken.
