MDAC acquired the first set of "smart" traps in August 2020, and currently these traps are being used in a 30-day test period in southwest Mississippi. The traps are powered by Mississippibased HogEye Camera Systems which allow for remote trapping capability wherever there is cellular signal. Once the test phase is completed, MDAC will open an application period in late September for farmers to submit trapuse applications. "NOTICE OF A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED BUDGET AND PROPOSED TAX LEVIES FOR THE **UPCOMING FISCAL YEAR FOR THE** TOWN OF GOODMAN"

The Town of Goodman will hold a public hearing on its proposed budget and proposed tax levies for the fiscal year 2021 Tuesday, September 8, 2020, 4:00 p.m., at the Goodman Town Hall located at 9912 Main Street, Goodman, MS.

The Town of Goodman is now operating with projected total budget revenue of \$486,000. \$65,000, or 14% of such revenue is obtained through Ad Valorem Taxes. For the next fiscal year, the proposed budget has total projected revenue of \$ 497,650. Of that amount, 13% or \$70,000 is to be financed through a total ad valorem tax levy.

The decision to not increase the ad valorem tax millage rate for the fiscal year 2021 above the current fiscal year's ad valorem tax millage rate means you will not pay more in ad valorem taxes on your home, automobile tag, utilities, business fixtures and equipment and rental and real property, unless the assessed value of your property has increased for the fiscal year 2020.

The Town of Goodman millage rate remains the same as last year at 37.78.

Any citizen of the Town of Goodman is invited to attend this public hearing on the proposed budget and tax levies for the fiscal year 2021 and will be allowed to speak for a reasonable amount of time and offer tangible evidence before any vote is taken.
