Remove standing water from around your home. It only takes a bottle cap's worth of standing water to cause a mosquito problem.	When practical, wear long pants and long sleeves. Loose-fitting, light-colored clothing is best.	Use repellent! The EPA has registered repellents that have been reviewed and approved to pose minimal risk when used properly:
Common culprits that should be monitored regularly for standing water include:	Studies have shown that some mosquitoes are more attracted to dark clothing and can most readily bite through tight-fitting, loose-weave clothing.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •DEET (N, N-diethyl-m-toluamide) •Picaridin (KBR 3023) •Oil of lemon eucalyptus (p-methan 3,8-diol, or PMD)
