CCA boys basketball wins first District championship in school history

The Clinton Christian boys basketball team recently concluded another successful season.

Playing one of the most difficult schedules in MAIS, the Warriors finished 21 and 8 and won the first District championship in school history. The boys also reached the South State championship game for the fourth time in five years and qualified for the State tournament for the fifth straight year.

Freshman KJ Sykes led the team in scoring, assists and steals. He averaged 18 points, five assists and four steals per game. Eighth grader Kari Hamilton scored fifteen a game and led the Warriors by grabbing eight rebounds per contest.

Senior Collin Stepp averaged ten points

and hit big three pointers during the season. Junior Devin Collins led the team in three-point shooting, while junior Devin Brown contributed on the boards and led CCA in blocked shots.

Junior Noah Murray provided great energy defensively while also scoring eight points a game. Senior Parker Westbrook cracked the starting line up late in the year and became an important contributor during the boys' playoff run.

Sykes, Hamilton and Collins made the South State All tournament team and joined Stepp, Brown and Murray on the All District 3 squad.

The CCA boys fell short of their goal of winning the AAA State Championship this year, but plan on using that as motivation for the 2020-21 season.
