The doxology and a prayer was led by David Steveline, First United Methodist Church, in front of the Gee's home.

The celebration was enhanced by the generosity of Clinton Fire Chief Jeff Blackledge furnishing a fire truck at the front of the subdivision and Police Chief Ford Hayman having several police cars escort Gee from the front of the subdivision. The celebration was a complete surprise to Linda.
