Kid's Towne Park to reopen May 22

The Clinton Parks and Recreation Department has been working diligently to complete the new playground at Kid's Towne Park. Delayed by rain twice and then by the Coronavirus shutdown, Parks and Recreation Officials hope to have the playground and park back open

to the public on

May 22. Kid's Towne Park is located at 915 Old Vicksburg Road in Clinton.

the legacy of the 23-year-old community-built park. The upgrade of the park to a new state-of-the-art play-on-play structure is designed to remind residents of the significant contributions of those who worked diligently to make the park a reality over two decades ago.

Kid's Towne Park is the second public Playcore Play On! Promoting Physical Activity National Demonstration Site in the state of Mississippi. The first was the new playground at Clinton's Robinson Park.

"Achieving this designation as the first and second play structure of its kind at a public park in the State of Mississippi is a noteworthy achievement by our Parks and Recreation Department," said Clinton Mayor Phil Fisher.

The National Demonstration Site is built towards allowing children to exercise while playing on the playground equipment. While childhood obesity is continually becoming a problem, these playgrounds allow a child to play and exercise at the same time.

The playground structure will have six key play elements that promote fitness – balancing, brachiating, climbing, spinning, sliding and swinging. Children exercise in different ways than adults, focusing more on short bursts and using their bodies in different directions. The

elements from the Kids Towne

playground structure will provide that ability for children.

Parks and Recreation Director Adam Wade said that the playground elements are designed to stimulate the mind and

imagination, as well as provide physical activity.

"While a child uses the playground for exercise, they are also being challenged mentally and socially through the interactive elements now being designed into playgrounds. Clinton Parks and Recreation are excited to be the first park in Mississippi to achieve this designation."

City officials say Kid's Towne Park's new playground will feature better sight lines and enhanced play elements for interactive play, as well as a natural tree shade canopy to shelter users from the elements.

Parks and Recreation officials plan to add new swing sets and an upgraded one-mile walking trail to connect the Bark Park and Kid's Towne Park to additional fitness opportunities.

Finally, new security systems will be installed at the park to monitor activity in the hours that the park is closed.
