


Curbside Service



Get ready to vote - Obtaining an absentee ballot is quick, easy and convenient

The voter registration deadline is October 5. Voters can check their registration status online at mvp.sos.ga.gov.

Georgians can request an absentee ballot for the November election by going online to a website Secretary of State Brad Raffensperger's office launched re-

Located at ballotrequest.sos.ga.gov, the website allows users to request that an absentee ballot be mailed to them, which they can then return by mail or place in one of the drop-off boxes that were installed across the state ahead of the June primaries.

With the Coronavirus pandemic

raging, Georgians voted by mail in record numbers in June and are expected to do so again in November. Many of those who waited to vote in person in June were forced to wait in long, socially distanced lines that in some cases took

Raffensperger's office sent request forms for absentee ballots to every registered voter in Georgia ahead of the primaries. But he decided not to do that ahead of the November election after fellow Republicans, including House Speaker David Ralston, complained the practice could encourage fraud.

The Secretary of State responded by developing the website to make it easy for Georgians who want to vote through the mail to request an absentee ballot.

The agency also expects to realize huge savings by using the website rather than paying the postage to mail absentee ballot request forms to about seven million registered voters.

When a voter clicks on the website, he or she is prompted to supply personal data including name, date of birth and home county. The data then goes to the appropriate county elections office, which sends out the absentee ballot.

The new system has been put through several weeks of testing by cybersecurity experts working with the secretary of state's office.

Voters who wish to cast absentee ballots are being asked not to procrastinate. The U.S. Postal Service is asking voters to allow 15 days for delivery each way.

partment of Economic Development, regional, and local development authorities across the district. "I will be a cheerleader for real economic development in the 2nd District. Georgia is the best place in the nation to do business and I will take a seat at the table to be a voice for the 2nd District."

Fly's in the Buttermilk; Shoo, Fly, Shoo

Football season is here and tailgating is a must. This smoky snack mix is great for tailgating. It has some tasty ingredients, and can be baked days before serving. After baking and cooling, store in airtight container up to five days in fridge.

Smoky Snack Mix

- 2 cups crispy corn snack crackers (such as Bugles) 2 cups rice cereal squares (such as Rice Chex)
- 2 cups bite-size cheese crackers (such as Cheez-it)
- 1 cup mini pretzels
- 1 cup smoked almonds
- 6 tablespoons butter, melted plus 1 teaspoon chili powder
- 1 teaspoon salt, and 1\2 teaspoon garlic powder

Preheat oven to 325 degrees.

Toss together all the cereals, crackers, pretzels, and the smoked almonds in a large bowl. In the warm melted butter put the chili powder, salt, and garlic powder, stir to mix. Drizzle over the snack mixture and toss to coat. Spread mixture in a single layer on a rimmed baking sheet lined with parchment paper. Bake in preheated oven until lightly toasted, about 10-14 minutes, stirring once or twice during baking. Cool completely on baking sheet. Store in airtight container. GO TEAM!!
