Gilbert Horton is happy to be home and a COVID-19 survivor

Eighty-eight year old Gilbert Horton did not feel well, and he knew what to do - do not delay but seek help.

Mr. Horton told his daughter, Roxanne Lonski, who lives in New London, NC, "I went as soon as I did not feel right". He was admitted to Bainbridge Hospital on August 5th and was diagnosed with COVID-19.

He was treated by his long-time friend and doctor, Dr. Sydney Cochran, with Remdesivir, then blood plasma with C19 antibodies. He began feeling better, then his doctor said he had a bit of pneumonia, so he was treated with antibiotics for that for a few days.

On Wednesday, September 2, he was released from the hospital.

His daughter comments, "What a story! Dad has held out a light for all of our family to show us that this virus is defeatable, and we believe his light will be good news to many who are scared-crazy about it".

Mr. Horton lives in the Lake Seminole area of Donalsonville.
