The AMA cooperates on a wide variety of ministries and worship experiences, including:

Pete's Pantry
Pete's Pantry exists to help people from the communities of Alexandria, Orestes and Summitville who are experiencing some form of crisis in their lives. Pete's Pantry is located at the Lutheran Church of Our Blessed Savior, 309 West Washington Street, and is open from 9:30 to 11 a.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Families and individuals in need can receive food and special assistance at this location.

Pete's Pantry is staffed entirely by volunteers and supported by donations from local churches and individuals with 100 percent of each contribution going directly toward meeting the needs of those it serves. The ERF can be reached at 724-7566.

Weekday Religious Education (WRE)

Indiana state law provides for fifth graders to be given weekday religious education with parental permission. The AMA maintains a 12-week Weekday Religious Education program in which area fifth graders are bussed to a local congregation for an hour of religious instruction. Volunteers come into the churches and teach basic religious values. In Alexandria, it is typical for 100 percent of parents of eligible students to give permission for their children to attend WRE. All expenses are paid for by WRE, which is financed by

area churches, individuals and a special offering collected at a community worship service.

Youth

Working in cooperation with the senior graduating class, the AMA sponsors a baccalaureate service at the First Baptist Church just prior to commencement exercises. Senior class officers and others plan the service in cooperation with the AMA, which provides the support and finances necessary to attract guest speakers. The service is led by members of the senior class.
The AMA has sponsored a variety of special worship and fellowship for all of the youth of the Alexandria area.

Sports

The AMA supports a church volleyball league and encourages a healthy setting for residents to enjoy friendly competition, exercise and fel-

lowship.

Seminar

Each year, Owens and Noffze funeral homes sponsor a breakfast and seminar for the AMA, on the subject of pastoral caregiving. The seminar is a time when city clergy members can listen to informed speakers and meet before the association dismisses for the summer.

Community Worship

Twice a year, the AMA sponsors special community worship experiences. On Good Friday a community service is held at one of the area churches. Traditionally, all of the participating churches take part in a united effort to remember the day Jesus was crucified.
