The Alexandria Building Commissioner ensures the city's homes and businesses are safe and viable structures in compliance with state and local building codes. The Building Commissioner's responsibilities include issuing building, demolition, fence, and sign permits, inspecting properties to ensure all codes are followed, enforcing code violations for unsafe structures, excessive trash violations, litter, junk, weeds, mowing, and tall grass. NOTE: If you or your building contractor in the City of Alexandria is making improvements to your property or home, inside or outside, at the cost of \$1,000 or more, you need to obtain a building permit before construction begins.
