This is to give notice that the Choctaw County Commission has determined that the following proposed action under Community Development Block Grant and Choctaw County Road Improvements Project number CY-CM-PF-19-008 is located in the 100-year floodplain and wetlands, and the Choctaw County Commission will be identifying and evaluating practicable alternatives to locating the action in the floodplain and wetlands and the potential impacts on the floodplain and wetlands from the proposed action, as required by Executive Order 11988 and 11990, in accordance with HUD regulations at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management and Protection of Wetlands.
