

School District Update: Letter From Superintendent Tracy

Dear Parents and Community Members:

As a school district, we have been closely monitoring the news and best practices regarding the spread of the coronavirus disease (CO-VID-19). Governor Pritzker has ordered all Illinois public and private schools to be closed. Villa Grove CUSD #302 will be closed from Tuesday, March 17 until classes resume on Wednesday, April 8.

The closure affects all school programming, including before- and after-school activities, all athletic and extracurricular practices and competitions, and all weekend events.

District teachers and staff have been preparing remote learning packets for our students. If you have any questions, please contact your child's building principal.

The coronavirus is thought to be spread via person-to-person contact through contaminated air droplets from coughing and sneezing by an infected person. As with controlling the spread of other viruses, we urge you to speak to your child about the following prevention measures:

about 20 seconds. Be sure to also wash your fingertips.

Avoid coughing or sneezing into your hands or in the air. Always try to cough or sneeze into a tissue, then throw the tissue away. If you don't have a tissue, cough/ sneeze into your arm.

As much as you can, avoid touching your eyes. mouth and nose.

The symptoms of coronavirus are similar to the regular seasonal influenza and include fever, lethargy, lack of appetite, and coughing. Some people with coronavirus have reported additional symptoms, such as a runny nose, sore throat, nausea, vomiting, and diarrhea. In some situations, the virus can develop into pneumonia.

Individuals who need medical care should call their medical provider to report their illness prior to seeking care at a clinic, physician's office, or hospital.

Tornado Sheltering Guidelines Seek the best available refuge area immediately when a Tornado Warning is issued. The US National Weather Service of Central Illinois gives sound advice in the event of possible tornadoes: If the atmosphere becomes favorable for tornadoes, a Tornado Watch may be issued. A Tornado Watch means that any storm that forms in and around the watch area could produce a tornado and you should prepare to act if a warning is issued. If a storm is about to produce a tornado, or if one is occurring, the National Weather Service will issue a Tornado Warning. If a warning is issued for your area, seek shelter immediately. Shelter: Lowest floor, interior room of a permanent structure, preferably a designated storm shelter not a shelter: A mobile home, car, highway overpass or under any bridge.
