Greene County High School continues to produce graduates that go on to excel after high school, whether in the workplace or in college. That goes for the school's student athletes who earn the opportunity to continue playing the sports while furthering their educations.

GCHS currently has numerous alumni at colleges and universities across the state and other parts of the country in multiple sports, including six baseball and softball players on rosters this spring.

Drake Henderson saw his senior year of high school Robinson's 3-6 cut short by the coronavirus, but that didn't stop him from drawing a ton of interest from collegiate

coaches. The rangy lefty decided Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College was the best fit for him and is off to a hot start in his freshman season with the Bulldogs. player and will make an .357 mark with four RBIs impact in the outfield for the Lady Eagles this spring," Robinson said.


Over in Goodman, 2019 GCHS graduate Kenneth Moore is in his second year as an infielder and pitcher with Holmes Community College. He was batting at a
