Anyone 70 years and older, regardless of health status or preexisting

To make an appointment, please go to HYPERLINK "http://www.muschealth.org/vaccine-la" www.muschealth.org/vaccine-scheduling. At this point, you will be asked questions to ensure you can proceed with scheduling. As you proceed to schedule, sign in as a GUEST, even if you have a MyChart account.

Once you are in the link, you may choose from among the sights closest to you to schedule your date and time.

When presenting for your vaccine appointment, you will be required to show identification that you fall into one of the afore mentioned
