2021 Spring Preview – Andrew Jackson Volunteers

Ranked #4 in the State 2AA Pre-Season Poll by S.C. Baseball Coaches Association (SBCA), the Andrew Jackson Volunteers are looking forward to the start of the 2021 season after a 5-0 start last season ended abruptly due to COVID -19. After losing six (6) players to graduation Andrew Jackson is poised to continue its success with three (3) seniors and a talented group of underclassmen returning. Though young, the 2021 Volunteers will have experience with seven (7) starters and nine (9) lettermen returning.

The pitching staff will be young with only one (1) senior but still should prove to be a strength for the Volunteers in the Spring. On the mound the Volunteers will be led by Wake Forest commit Kyle Percival (Junior, 6' 5", LHP). The (DP) Palmetto Games Participant pitched 7 1/3 innings in last years shortened season posting a 0.00 ERA with (11) K's and (4) BB's. His mental toughness and willingness to complete at the highest level will be counted on in 2021. A newcomer to the Volunteers Baseball Program, College of Charleston commit Ashton Phillips (Junior, 6' 0", RHP) a (DP) and a Palmetto Games Participant will be relied upon heavily in the starting rotation. Phillips is coming off a tremendous season in the Diamond Prospects (DP) Fall League and has continued to follow that up with hard work in the weight room this fall/winter. All purpose "Swiss Army Knife" Bry Neal (Senior, 6' 0"RHP) will be counted on as a starter and reliever. Prior to the shortened season ending in 2020 Neal pitched (11) innings with a 1.09 ERA, (20) K's and (3) BB's. His leadership and experience will be invaluable to the team's success this spring. Landon Peavy. (Sophomore, 6' 0", RHP) and Bryce Helms (Junior, 6' 3", RHP) will be relied upon to pitch meaningful innings, during the season as starters and relievers. Other pitchers with the opportunity to "Step Up" and compete for Varsity innings include Cameron Campbell (Sophomore, 5' 10", RHP). Joaquin Espinoza (Sophomore, 5' 10", RHP), and Hammond Wrenn (Sophomore, 6' 0", RHP).

All Region performer and USC Salkehatchie commit Gavin Phillips (Senior) will return to handle the catching duties for the Volunteers. In last year's shortened season Phillips hit .385, had (6) RBI's, and drew (5) BB's. As a 4-year starter and 5-year letterman he serves as an anchor in the storm of the game. Without a doubt his toughness, experience, and competitive spirit will play a huge role in determining the Volunteers final destination. Cameron Campbell (Sophomore) will be looking to solidify his backup role behind the plate this Spring.

The defense should be another strength for Andrew Jackson in 2021 with more team speed and athleticism. First (1st) base will return experience and depth with Kyle Percival (Junior) who hit .429 with (4) RBI's in last year's shortened season and Landon Williams (Senior, 2-sport athlete). Fuller Sims (Sophomore 2-sport Athlete) and Skyler Hegler

(8th Grade, 3-sport - Athlete) will provide solid depth and could compete for playing time.

All purpose, 3-year starter Bry Neal (Senior) will help anchor the defense from third (3rd) base. When Neal is on the mound competition for playing time will be stiff between Joaquin Espinoza (Sophomore), Skyler Hegler (8th Grade), and Cameron Campbell (Sophomore). The middle infield returns multi-talented Landon Peavy (Sophomore) at shortstop (SS). Peavy flashes a solid skill set

with his bat speed, fielding ability, arm strength, and speed. This was evident with Peavy making the Diamond Prospect (DP) Fall League All Star Team and being named the Top Position Player Prospect in the 2023 Class at the 2020

Diamond Prospect (DP) Fall Showcase. Second (2nd) Base will come down to competition with returning starter Andrew Taylor (Sophomore) holding a slight edge over returning letterman Joaquin Espinoza (Sophomore) and newcomer Will Rape (Sophomore).

The Volunteers outfield will be led by Junior speedster Bryce Helms (2-sport Athlete). The junior hit .467 in the COVID-19 shortened season and stole 6 bases. Helms showcased his speed in winter conditioning running a 6.77 in the 60-yard dash. He is the ultimate team player that displays a tremendous work ethic, mental toughness, and the unwillingness to lose. Ashton Phillips (Junior) is the front runner for an outfield spot when not pitching. His bat speed, arm strength, and foot speed provide him with a distinct advantage. On the surface the other outfield position looks like a battle between senior Landon Williams (2-sport athlete) and Hammond Wrenn (Sophomore) Wrenn a three (3-sport athlete) has speed, a strong arm, and the ability to make good reads on the ball. Other outfielders that will make a push for playing time this Spring include Cameron Campbell (Sophomore) and Banks Helms (Freshman). To accomplish their team goals in 2021 the Volunteers must continue with their hard work, show improvement in the

The Volunteers will be tested throughout the season beginning with tough scrimmages against South Pointe and York Comprehensive. The start of the Season begins with the Volunteers co-hosting the "Comporium Preseason Invitational" then participating in a Spring Break Tournament. A competitive Non-Region schedule against Camden, Robert E. Lee, and Indian Land coupled with playing in one of the toughest AA Regions in the state will prepare the Volunteers for the challenge of returning to the playoffs.


