Behind Dane, he is probably our second biggest kid and second strongest kid. To be a sophomore, the kid is massive. We just need Javi to be a little more aggressive be a little meaner and a little nastier. Like Jamison, when he wants to turn it on - he is unblockable. We need more consistency from him on SCHSATGORDONSVILLE offense. We need him to also be a two-way player for us and perform at a higher level along that offensive line and play to his size.

#79 BRAXTON SIRCY (6'0", 240 lb., OL/DL) "Braxton is a big kid that shows up everyday. He is a hard worker. We just have to work on his technique a little bit and his fundamentals. He will be one of those rotational guys that gives us help.

"It is a large sophomore class but those are the guys who highlight that group and help us coming out of that sophomore class.'
