"The windmill also has alternative forms of energy which most kids have never seen," said Tyler. "It pumps water from a well into the pond, and the plan is to retain some of that water to water the plants." Beautiful iris's and azaleas grow in front of the windmill.

"We have a retention pond that retains water all year round, or at least it has for the past several years," said Tyler. "It's a great place for kids to come and find tadpoles and frogs and turtles and snakes and all sorts of critters. It also has a nice picnic area and place to sit."



## THE PATHWAY DREAM

Out of necessity, The Garden has plans to install a lengthy path to integrate existing and newly purchased properties. A dream was hatched to bring meaning to this pathway, and thus- The Path of Hope and Healing was born. The path is intended to take advantage of the healing powers of nature and to uplift all of us affected by cancer. A 300-foot stamped concrete path will be lined with 12 handmade glass cancer ribbons. Brook White, a glass artist originally from Daviess Co, has agreed to create these glass ribbons using the colors of cancer that represent the top 12 cancers diagnosed in KY. The landscaped path will lead to an amazing butterfly sculpture where the same colors will be used in the wings of the butterflies. Dr. Bill Tyler says, "If we can get funding for this, we'll do it. It would be a great thing for the community and for the people who come from all over the country. We've looked this up and it's amazing there are no generalized gardens for healing and health associated with cancer, and for those who are affected by it, either because of the disease directly, or a family member."

The Garden has applied for a grant from Impact 100, and has made it to be 1 of 5 finalists competing for 2 separate \$100,000 grants. They will need more funding to supplement the grant to complete the project. The sculpture would also become a significant tourist attraction.
