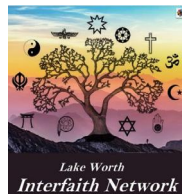

## NRA Signs MOU with U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service

FAIRFAX, Va. - The National Rifle Association is pleased to announce the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding today with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) to assist in the recruitment, education, and retaining of sportsmen and women through NRA's vast hunter education and outreach programs.

"Together with the USFWS, the NRA has worked for decades to ensure as many outdoorsmen and women as possible can safely and responsibly enjoy our hunting heritage," said Jason Ouimet, executive director of NRA's Institute for Legislative Action. "We look forward to a formalization of this longstanding relationship and thank Director Skipwith for her tireless work on this effort."

A ten-year agreement, the MOU outlines the agreements and responsibilities of both parties including a commitment to science-based strategies for wildlife conservation along with NRA's pledge to enhance hunter safety, marksmanship, and shooting safety through their free online hunter education program, the Hunters' Leadership Forum, the Youth Hunter Education Challenge, the Women's Wilderness Escape and its magazine, American Hunter, to achieve these goals.

"This MOU strengthens our shared commitment to wildlife and natural resource conservation while preserving our American heritage of hunting and recreating outdoors," said U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Director Aurelia Skipwith. "This partnership supports the Trump Administration and Secretary of the Interior David Bernhardt's priority of increasing access to public lands and expanding hunting opportunities while promoting the safe, responsible use of firearms."

## Artists to Begin Work On Unity Wall in LW Beach

*Wall with a history of separating white from black communities to be turned into a symbol of unity*

The Whispering Palm Neighborhood Association and Healthier Lake Worth Beach, a Palm Health Foundation initiative, has come together to repaint and revitalize the Lake Worth Beach Unity Wall. This wall is a 1,100-foot cinder block wall that runs along Wingfield Street in the South end of Lake Worth Beach. There was a time when this wall represented separation. Today this wall will forever stand for people of all races and cultures coming together to break down the walls and barriers of hate, injustice.

Built in 1954, the wall served as an unofficial border between residents of the "Osborne Colored Addition" and their white neighbors in the Whispering Palms community at the city's south end. In 1954, the city's zoning code required Black residents to live in the Osborne subdivision. It remained that way until 1969.

"For today's generation and society, that wall does not represent segregation anymore," said Retha Lowe, the city's first Black commissioner and a lifelong resident of the Osborne community. "It's about bringing our city together - all types of people. That's what it represents today for our community - a wall of unity."

Work on the wall will begin Saturday, Jan. 16, from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Work on the wall will continue each Saturday over the next six to eight weeks until the project is complete.

The Osborne Community Unity Wall is located on Wingfield Street, near the corner of 12th Avenue South, in Lake Worth Beach. The Unity Wall extends almost four blocks on Wingfield Street.
