Call 2-1-1... Your Call For Help Celebrating 50 Years

There is nothing wrong in asking for help. It is wrong if you don't call 2-1-1. They are here to help. 211 can be your 'community life-line and most importantly, the call you make may save your life. 3 digits 211 can change your life. So many things have changed because of Covid-19, but 211 is not one of them.

For 15 years, Patrice Schroder has been the Community Relation Specialist. She has a magnetic and caring personality with a Master of Arts in Human Behavior. She has learned her listening lessons well.

On February 11, 2002 Palm Beach County's Hospice, Health and Crisis Agency implemented the 211 code for Palm Beach County. On January 1, 2003, Indian River, Martin, Okeechobee and St. Lucie Counties joined PBC. 211 is that valuable life-saving service that has its offices with our neighbor - Lantana.

The Palm Beach/Treasurer Coast 211 is a Florida 501(c) non-profit agency. Its mission "is to connect people to services 24 hours a day by understanding their individual, emotional, financial and community needs to support the health system as a whole."

According to Schroder, the sponsors and those who work with 211, the highly trained professionals and the trained volunteers that share vast amounts of time and money are the ones to thank.

Such sponsors as PBC Commission, PBC Sheriff's Office, The United Way, PBC Children's Services, The Town of Palm Beach, The City of Boca Raton, Southeast Florida Behavioral Network, The National Suicide Prevention Lifeline and those special people finding answers and reaching out to the people who are in need.

Patrice and the entire highly educated, qualified and motivated staff have been there for nearly 50 years. There is just one word. They CARE.

As dedicated as the professionals are, the trained volunteers are there to listen and to help. All the approximately 350 calls a day and three million calls per year are confidential.

The 211 Call Center is divided into areas of needs and services. The "Hub" is a huge bank of phones. Each phone is answered by a trained person who knows how to direct your call to a specific person or service.

211 is the number for many that is called when

someone doesn't know where to turn. That person may be contemplating suicide.

211 specializes in Crisis Intervention and Suicide Prevention...24 hours, seven days a week. 211 has someone you can talk to and knows how to help. Do you need to talk to someone?

Senior CareGiver Project is the newest 211 project. It is estimated that in Palm Beach County there is a population of 1.5 million people. Of that number, 65,000 are over 65 in age.

One of the very special Senior Care Programs is the Sunshine Program. These special people are trained volunteers. They call and listen. Do you know someone that needs that special love of a call? 211. Do you know a senior that needs food? 211. Do you know a senior that needs a ride to the doctor? 211.


If you have a question that is related to a senior, 211 might just have the answer for you.

There are those that need to talk, but hate the phone. 211 has the answer. It is called Chat via Text Message. You type in your zip code + the number 898211.

211 provides you with help that provides you with answers. For example:

1. Where do I get the basic needs such as food, clothes rent/utility assistance?
2. Who knows about the City, County, State governments. Where is the nearest library? Where do I go to have my license renewed?
3. My mother is having mental issues, where is the nearest Mental Health doctor, Hospital?
4. Did you know that Senior Care is for ages 18 to 118?
5. I need help with my baby! 211 is the place for the answers. "Help Me Grow" has the answers. For example, What do I do when my one-year old eats Fido's poop?
6. Veterans... "My Florida" has been designed just for you. There is Peer to Peer with someone that has been there. Or, What can I do to help?
7. October is Domestic Violence Month. Victims can now call 211.
8. "I would like to volunteer." 211 can use you, but know you will have to be trained. It takes training to learn how to listen. That would be a great lesson for us all.

Do you have a problem? Take a minute. Call 211. They might be able to help you 'navigate' the system. By calling, the life you save might just be your own. Remember 211 CARES...about you!
