## Bill Bone Tropical Triathlon Set for Oct. 24th

Lake Worth Beach, FL -- Over 200 athletes are set to compete in the 23rd Annual Bill Bone Tropical Triathlon, scheduled to take place on Sunday, October 24, 2021 at Lake Worth Beach.

The race starts at 7:15am. Male and Female triathletes ages 14 to 80, representing all experience levels come to compete from all over the state of Florida. Lake Worth Beach is the starting point of the race, where triathletes complete a quarter mile swim, followed by a 13 mile bike, taking them along Federal Highway and through downtown, followed by a

3.1 mile run over the intra-coastal bridge and through Bryant Park area before heading back to the beach for the finish line.

Packet Pick-up will take place the day before, which is Saturday, October 23rd, under the pavilion in front of the pier at our beautiful beach from 2pm-6pm. To facilitate the safety of the athletes, certain streets will be temporarily restricted/closed from

7:00am-10:00am. Those streets include:

Lake Avenue from Dixie Highway to A1A

Lucerne Avenue from A1A to Dixie Highway

Federal Highway from 12th Avenue South to Wellesley Drive

J, K, L, M, North O, Ocean Breeze from 1st Avenue South to 2nd Avenue North

Palmway from 2nd Avenue North to 5th Avenue South

Traffic over the Robert Harris Bridge will be detoured north to Southern Blvd. and south to Ocean Avenue bridges. A1A will be closed at intersection.

# Suspect Shot in Lake Worth Beach Burglary

Shortly after 4:00 a.m., Palm Beach County Sheriff's Deputies responded to a reported shooting at Lighthouse Smoke and Vape Shop at 27 South Dixie Highway in Lake Worth Beach.

Upon arrival, deputies located a male suffering from gunshot wound(s). The victim of the shooting was transported to a local hospital where he is listed in stable condition and is expected to survive.

PBSO Detectives arrived and initiated

an investigation. During the investigation, detectives learned that the suspect threw a rock through the Lighthouse Smoke & Vape Shop window which sounded an alarm and alerted the business owner. The business owner responded to his business and a confrontation occurred resulting in the suspect, a juvenile, getting shot.

The investigation continues and the suspect will be charged when he recovers from his wounds.

## STAMP COLLECTING WITH DAN MADDALINO

When we celebrate our fighting and defense forces, often overlooked is our U.S. Merchant Marine.

Since the formation of our country, America's merchant ships have sailed the world transporting passengers, goods, and the mail. During wartime, they have delivered troops and war materials. This role was formalized shortly before World War II, when the U.S. Merchant Marine was empowered to serve as a naval auxiliary unit. During that war the U.S. Merchant Marine bore the brunt of delivering military supplies overseas to U.S.

forces and allies. Their service was honored with the Merchant Marine stamp issued February 26, 1946 (Scott #939). This 3-cent blue-green commemorative shows a Liberty Ship unloading cargo.

On July 28, 2011, the United States Postal Service once again brought focus to the long history and role of the merchant marine in sustaining the American Economy. The issuance of a four-stamp set (Scott #4548-4551), which show four different types of vessels, brings honor to the able-bodied seamen working the sea-lanes. The

featured types of vessels that have formed an important part of the history of the U.S. Merchant Marine are clipper ships, auxiliary steamships, Liberty ships, and container ships.

When adding those stamps to your collection that honor the men and women of the Army, Navy, Airforce, Marines, and Coast Guard, do not overlook your Merchant Marine. Drop anchor at a Cresthaven Stamp Club meeting and load-up with other historic postage stamps.

#### Filing Fees

The Filing Fee includes a qualifying fee of \$25 to the City, plus a State Assessment fee of \$245 (1% of annual commissioner salary), paid with 2 separate checks written from the campaign bank account. All Candidates must be registered voters and have resided in their district in the City for 6 months prior to November 9, 2021.

All Candidates shall be elected by the Voters of the City at Large on a nonpartisan basis.

#### Voter Registration

The registration books will close on Monday, February 7, 2022 for the March 8, 2022 election.
