Royal Poinciana Park Ribbon Cutting

On October 1, community partners came together for the celebration of the Royal Poinciana Park Ribbon Cutting in Lake Worth Beach. This \$452,556 project was funded in part with a \$290,548 Palm Beach County Community Development Block Grant to further the County's initiative towards "The Trust for Public Land". The County's goal is that every resident have access to walk 10-minutes or a half-mile to a wellmaintained park. That goal is now 80 percent met and this neighborhood park is the 364th Park in Palm Beach County. The partnership includes the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners, Palm Beach County's Department of Housing & Economic Development,

the City of Lake Worth Beach, Healthier Lake Worth, and the Royal Poinciana Neighborhood Association. The former vacant parcel now has amenities that include an ADA accessible sidewalk, playground equipment, awnings, a covered picnic table, and an already popular soccer field. If you would like to check out the park yourself, it is located on South B Street between Lake Avenue and 1st Avenue South.

"It's inspiring to see so many members of the community come together for such a worthwhile project. This park will serve families and their children for many years to come by providing a valuable neighborhood resource" said Mayor Dave Kerner.
