It's all about relationships

As a student in a counseling program, one of the most important concepts was learning how to develop relationships with clients. During the program it was drilled that building trust is essential. In order to build trust one must: Let people tell you what they need you to know. Questions should be limited to clarify their story. Too many questions become an interrogation making people uncomfortable. Next, you encourage their story with what is known as minimal encouragers: the nod of the head, leaning in and "yes" words.

Also, summarizing the main points of the story to make sure you have it right and to assure the person that you have heard them. In counseling, building the relationship is everything. In life, building relationships is everything. We all need someone to hear us. Miles Franklin is quoted as saying, "Someone to tell it to - is one of the fundamental needs of human beings." These counseling principles apply to all relationships. So, let's recap: listen when people talk, give your full attention when someone is speaking,

don't interrupt their story, encourage every word, don't ask questions except to clarify and let them tell you the entire story. People want to know you care about them. Relationships develop when two people care enough to listen to one another's truth. Establishing and maintaining healthy relationships is one of the most important things we'll do in our lives.
