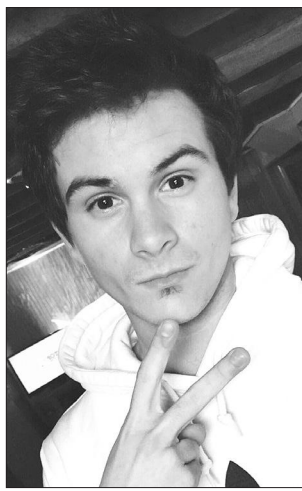
Jordan Isaiah Caven, 24
