- Build an emergency kit – a kit includes a battery-powered radio, flashlights for everyone in the family, fresh batteries for any devices, a first-aid kit, and over-the-counter and prescription medications.

- Stay away from fallen power lines – Strong wind, snow and ice accumulation on tree branches can sometimes cause them to break and fall into powerlines. Consider all fallen lines dangerous. Stay away and contact the utilities. Contact LG&E and KU – LG&E

and KU customers with registered accounts can report an outage online at lge-ku.com or by texting OUTAGE to 4LGEKU (454358).

To report a downed wire, LG&E customers should call 502-589-1444; KU customers should call 1-800-981-0600.

- Check out the online outage map – Customers can access the LG&E and KU outage map on the website from their mobile device to track weather conditions and receive near real-time information about outages throughout our system, a summary of outages by zip code and county, and an estimated restoration time.
