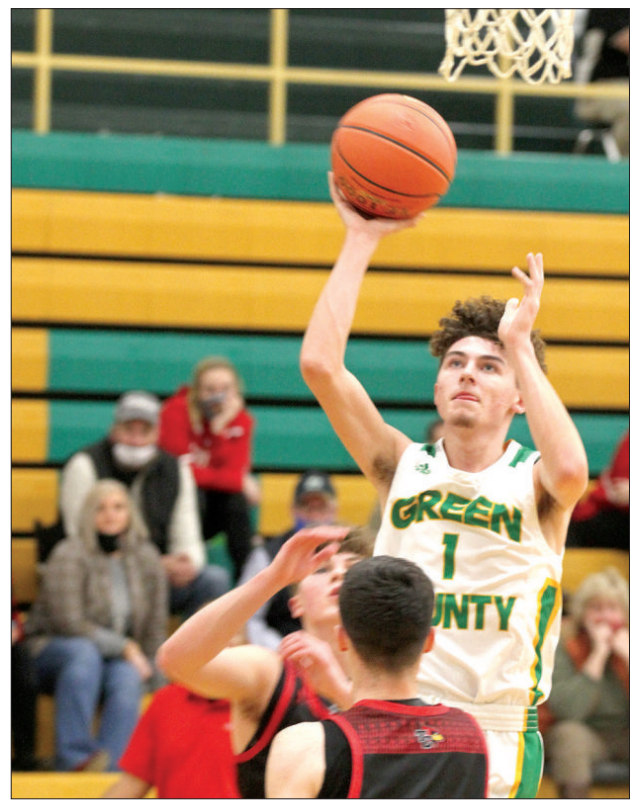
Gunner Bush continues to lead the Dragons with more than 17 points per game but the Dragons put up their lowest offensive output of the season against Adair, losing 53-49.
