Plans for the new building took shape over the course of several weeks, according to board member Hayes Moore.

"My initial blueprint was compiled from research of dozens of clubhouses and I tried to come up with a plan that was modern, feasible and expandable," Moore said. After considering multiple options and contractors, the Board selected Blevins Construction of Campbellsville, to build the new clubhouse.

Working closely with Rudy Renfrow of Blevins Construction, the final rendition made the cut with the following descriptive design:
