

Grant funds awarded to the local E-911 Center

The Greensburg/Green County E-911 Center recently found out they had been awarded two Kentucky Office of Homeland Security grants through the Kentucky E-911 Services Board in the amount of \$37,170.54.

A grant for \$24,980 will be utilized to upgrade the current

antiquated GIS mapping software in the center and will allow the center to remain in compliance with state standards.

Another grant for \$12,190.54 was awarded for a “refresh” of the E-911 hardware. The refresh is well overdue and must be done every five years.

E-911 Supervisor Toni Humphress

and Senior Telecommunicator Chryslee Sherill worked tirelessly on this project for several weeks and they deserve a huge show of appreciation,” Police Chief Wayne Hedgespeth said in a statement, “With these funds the citizens and visitors to Greensburg and green County will be safe and response times for emergencies will be quicker.”

KSP releases March report

During the month of March 2021, there were 16 traffic accidents investigated by the State Police working in the Post 15 area in the 11 counties of Adair, Casey, Clinton, Cumberland, Green, Marion, Metcalfe, Monroe, Russell, Taylor and Washington.

There were three fatal collisions during

the month of March in the Post 15 area.

Ricky Nelson, 57, Dawson, Ga., was killed March 15 in Adair County.

Lottie June Baker, 42, Cumberland County, was killed March 19 in Cumberland County.

Brandon M. Heath, 27, Harrah, Okla., was killed March 25 in Taylor County.

This brings the Post’s yearly fatality count to nine compared

with five through this same period in 2020.

Statewide fatality count stands at 149 compared with 143 through this same period in 2020.

During the month of March 2021, there were 1452 citations written, 246 courtesy notices written, 469 complaints answered, 127 motorists assisted, 79 criminal cases opened and 464 criminal arrests made.

Goff will receive intensive coffee training prior to opening and is confident her research has lead her to the best coffee bean selections.

“Our coffee will bring true quality to every cup and the relationships behind it,” she said.

The store will have the basic offerings at first— quality drip coffee, espressos, cappuccinos, lattes, macchiatos— and hope to transition into more elaborate beverages as time goes on and staff gets trained.

Lunch and dinner will also be available with a projected menu of homemade meatloaf, baked ham, roast beef Manhattan and more.

Pizza will be one of their big sellers they foresee, as they will offer Crazy Italian Pizzas, from basic to specialties. Pizzas are expected to be ready within 6-7 minutes

from the phone call. Along with pizza, chicken wings will be available to order.

All food will be served to go, however, a nice sitting area (inside an actual silo) is inside the store, for those wishing to have a seat or linger.

The store will have the regular coolers for drinks, fountain drinks, staples in a convenient store (chips, candy bars, etc.), plus health grab-&go items like salads, fruit cups, etc.

Mr. Goff advises he was approved for the NQ Retail Malt Beverage Package License, so there will be a beer cooler as well.

In addition to hot food items, the owners said there will be a full deli boasting basic meats and cheeses from Robertson Premium Meats, a Kentucky Proud company.

Gas lines were

placed March 22 and the finalization on the future pumps is underway.

While the winter weather and rainy slowed down the work, the spring weather has allowed continued progress.

“The goal is the first of May for gas,” Correy said.

The actual store is hopeful for a soft opening next week, via drive-thru only.

“Our projected goal is April 15 or 16 for the drive-thru only soft opening,” Goff said.

The store is also still accepting applications for all shifts, from those 21 and older. Those can be found online on their Facebook page, or in the store.

“We have been blessed with some great employees so far, and look forward to serving the local community,” Goff said.
