BBB warns: Sharing your senior photo on Facebook? Think twice!

It seems harmless and fun! A bunch of friends on Facebook or other social media are sharing their senior portraits, including the high school name and graduation year, to support the graduating class of 2021 (or years past to share their memories).

Be careful! Scammers or hackers who surf through social media sites will see these #ClassOf2021 posts and will now have the name of your high school and graduation

year, which are common online security questions. All it takes is an internet search to reveal more information about you, such as family members, your real name, birthdate or even where you live.

Better Business Bureau (BBB) cautions everyone to be aware of what they are sharing. Even if you think it's just going to your friends, it could also be going somewhere else.

Other recent viral personal list posts include all the cars you've owned (including makes/model years),

favorite athletes, and top 10 favorite television shows.

What most people forget is that some of these "favorite things" are commonly used passwords or security questions. If your social media privacy settings aren't high, you could be giving valuable information away for anyone to use.

Here are some tips to help keep you safe on social media:

- Resist the temptation to play along. While it's fun to see other's posts, if you are uncomfortable participating, it is best to

not do it.

- Review your security settings. Check your security settings on all social media platforms to see what you are sharing and with whom you are sharing.

- Change security questions/settings. If you are nervous about something you shared possibly opening you up to fraud, review and change your security settings for banking and other websites.

Parrott earns big win at CU: MSC Individual Championship

It was a strong day for the Campbellsville University women's golf team and an even stronger day for Gracie Parrott as Parrott earned the individual championship at the Mid-South Conference Tournament Friday afternoon. The Lady Tigers shot their team low for the tournament with a 313 (+25) as that score was also the lowest team round of the final round, outshooting champions University of the Cumberlands by a stroke. CU finished in second place with a three-round total of 944 (+80) as the Patriots won the team championship with a 927 (+63).

The story was Parrott, who becomes the first Lady Tiger to earn the individual championship since Cassidy Scantland did so in her freshman year of 2013-14. Parrott wrapped up the tournament with a three-round tourna-

ment total of 214 (-2) as the only player to shoot under par for the entire tournament.

Parrott had two days under par finishing her third round at 71 (-1) to beat Pikeville's Boo Newsome by 10 strokes as she shot an 80 (+8) on the final day to finish the tournament at 224 (+8). Going head-to-head with MSC Golfer of the Year, Carlee Shoemaker of University of the Cumberlands, Parrott outshot Shoemaker by six strokes in the final round to pull away and have Shoemaker finish in third at 225 (+9).

With the individual win, Parrott clinched the Mid-South Conference Freshman of the Year honor, also the first MSC Freshman of the Year award for the Lady Tigers since Scantland in 2013-14. Parrott will also accept the individual automatic bid to the NAIA Championships to be play on May 25-28 at Rose Creek Golf Course

in Oklahoma City.

The rest of the Campbellsville lineup did their part to pull the Lady Tigers ahead of Lindsey Wilson College by seven strokes after the Blue Raiders held the second place spot after the final rounds wrapped up on Friday morning. Playing holes 15 through 18 early on Friday morning Parrott finished up a 74 (+2), Abbie Coffey shot a 78 (+6), Connor Geraldts had an 80 (+8), Paige Ferguson finished at 85 (+13), and Cortney Withrow shot a second round 94 (+22).

With their combined performances between the MSC Spring and Fall Invites along with the MSC Championship scores, Parrott, Coffey, and Geraldts earned spots on the All-MSCTeams as Parrott is a First Team selection with Coffey and Geraldts on the Second Team.

In the final round behind Parrott, both Coffey and Geraldts put up matching scores of 80 (+8) with Withrow

scoring her best round of the tournament at 82 (+10), and Ferguson finishing up at 90 (+18).

The Lady Tigers will hope this week bolsters their resumé for a possible at large bid into the NAIA Championship to join Parrott as the full team as announcements for the full field will be made this week.

Gracie Parrott named MSC Freshman of the Year

After getting her true freshman season shortened by the COVID-19 outbreak, Campbellsville University women's golfer Gracie Parrott was named the Mid-South Conference Freshman of the Year following her win at the Mid-South Conference Championship Friday afternoon.

Parrott shot the lone under par score in the three-round tournament with rounds of 69 (-3), 74 (+2), and 71 (-1) to finish at 214 (-2). That 214 was 10 strokes better than the second place finisher as Parrott was able to cruise to the victory and clinch the Freshman of the Year honor. That honor is the first for CU since Cas-

sidy Scantland also did so the year she won the MSC Championship in 2013-14. The honor takes into account the three tournaments hosted by the conference in the Fall and Spring Invites.

At the MSC Fall Championships, Parrott finished tied for eighth with a two-round total of 160 (+16) at Bowling Green Country Club back on Oct. 30-31. At the Spring Preview, Parrott just missed out on the top 10 as she finished in 11th with a two-round 158 (+14) at Cumberland Mountain Bear Trace Golf Course in Crossville, Tenn. on Apr. 19-20.

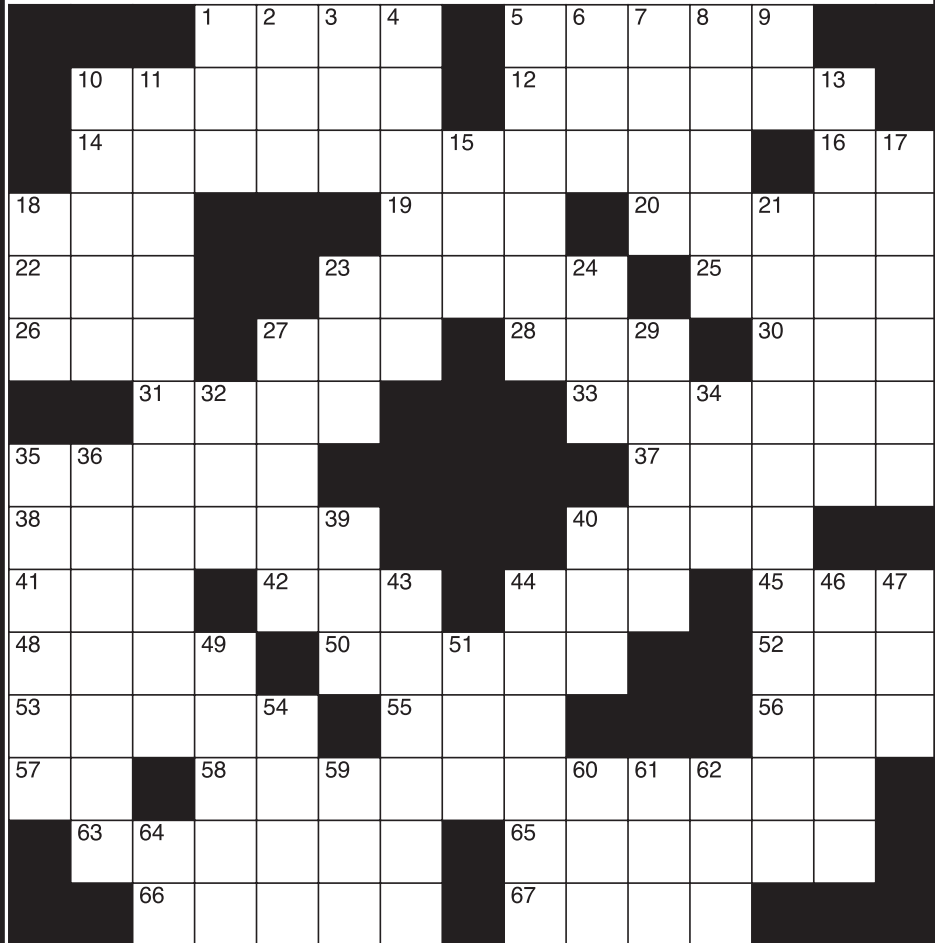
Missing out on the top 10 was rare for Parrott on the 2020-21 season as she won three tournaments in the MSC Championship,

the Lindsey Wilson College Invitational to open the fall and the Campbellsville Invitational. She also added a runner-up finish at the Music City Invitational, a fifth place finish at the TWU Spring Invite, and tied for 10th at the Roadrunner Invitational to finish the year with seven top 10 finishes individually.

Her three wins this season pushes her career wins total up to five now after winning twice in the 2019-20 season before the season was canceled.

With Parrott's victory at the MSC Championship, she has clinched an appearance in the NAIA Championships as an individual and hopes to be joined by her teammates if the Lady Tigers are to earn an at large bid as a team.
