Communities in Kentucky and southern Indiana came together for the 68th Annual WHAS Crusade for Children to make life better for children with special needs. The final tote board tallied \$5,100,000.

Since 1954, the Crusade has now raised a cumulative total \$200 million.

Locally, Greensburg-Green County raised \$18,107.28, with Summersville raising \$6,360.33, for a combined

total of nearly \$25,000.

"The WHAS Crusade for Children continues to be a great demonstration of caring and coming together for the greater purpose of helping children with special needs. After an especially tough year with significant losses, we are amazed by the dedication of the firefighters and volunteers.
