Beshear announces incentives to get people vaccinated, scholarships and three \$1 million drawings

As coronavirus vaccination rates in Kentucky keep slowing, Gov. Andy Beshear has announced new lotterystyle incentives: \$1 at least one, and 38.7% million each for three residents who have received at least one dose, and 15 education scholarships for children between the ages of 12 and 17 who have received at least one shot.
