# Dragons move to 7-0

Green County High School's football team improved to 7-0 following their 42-20 win over Warren Central Friday night.

This is the best start for Dragon football since 2008 when they won their first eight games of the season.

The Dragons are number four in Class 2A, according to their RPI. Ahead of them are Lexington Christian, Beechwood and Mayfield. Beechwood defeated Lexington Christian in overtime in last year's state

championship game.

"Handling success is probably the biggest struggle so far this year," said Head Coach Colt Phelps. "We've already had some conversations about this, and we'll probably have to have another heart-to-heart talk about expectations and how those expectations are a privilege and not a burden. Some of our players are upset when there is not a running clock before halftime. We want our team to have fun when they are playing."

The Dragons wasted no time in getting on the scoreboard against Warren Central.

Blake Houchens scored the first of his two touchdowns with 7:21 to go in the first quarter.

Just three minutes later, quarterback Zack Ferguson scored the first of his two touchdowns on a twenty-yard run and the score was 12-0.

The Dragons completely shut down the Warren Central rushing offense as Green County held them to a negative 16 yards rushing. It was Warren Central's passing that kept the game from being a complete blowout.

Warren Central

put together some big pass plays that Green County didn't stop and just before the end of the first quarter, Warren Central scored their first touchdown.

Warren Central is now 0-6 and averages only 16 points per game but has not been shut out in any game this year.

The second quarter was all Green County as the Dragons upped their lead to 34-6 by halftime. During the second quarter, in a seven-minute span, Green County scored three touchdowns.




Blake Bonta, a senior wide receiver for the Dragons, awaits the snap against Warren Central. Green County won 42-20 Friday night.
