GC Dragons win Tenn. XC meet

The Green County Varsity Cross Country team won their second consecutive meet. After winning the Heartland Athletic Conference Sept. 30 at Miller Park in Campbellsville, the Dragons won this past weekend the Cherokee Invitational in Knoxville, Tennessee. The team placed three runners in the top 10. They were: 2. Jayden Marr, recording a time of 17:52; 3. Zach Jewell, running in 18:02; and 10. Blake Bryant, finishing in 19:24. Also scoring for the Dragons were: 14.

Ethan Patterson – 19:42; and 33. Wesley Baker – 21:43. Additional individual results included: 38. Carter Smothers – 21:53; 42. Layton Froggett – 22:18; 57. Mason McKibben – 24:06; 60. Jeff York – 25:02; and 69. DJ Choate – 28:27. Sam Fulton, of Gatlinburg-Pittman High School, was the individual winner in the 5K run. Green County accumulated 49 points in winning the varsity race. Knoxville Ambassadors High School was second with 63; and Gatlinburg-Pittman High School placed third, tallying 74. “After spending a

few days of fall break together in Pigeon Forge, we travelled over to Knoxville to run in the Knoxville Invitational,” said Head Coach Erik Edwards. “We brought 10 young men with us, a mixture of high school and middle school to run in the varsity race. We ran this race two years ago and finished 5th in the team scoring. I knew we could compete with the best of that area. Out of several Tennessee teams and one from Georgia, we came away with the championship. The kids were so professional to refocus on the race after two days of fun. (It) was impressive to see. They over-

came many distractions that included a sloppy running surface that attributed to the slower times, but in the end it doesn’t matter how fast your time was as long as you beat everyone you can beat. That is just what they did. We had strong performances by our usual top 4 runners and a couple of postseason spots were cleared up in the process. Closing in on the end of the season, I think our MS team will compete for a top finish in the MS state meet on the 16th and we have (roughly) a couple of weeks to tighten our varsity team up for the regional in Muhlenberg County coming up.”

Rock Bridge, Tenn. High School was the individual winner of the 5K run, recording a time of 18:01.99. Rock Bridge was also the team champion, garnering 23 points. Daviess County finished runner-up, accumulating 63. Green County finished 13th, totaling 301. “Overall, the team looked much better compared to the Heartland Conference meet,” said Head Coach Grant Karnes. “I know that they are still not where they want to be and I know that they have not yet reached their potential. (Approximately) two weeks until region and we will use every day until then to prepare ourselves.”
