The Green County School system officially broke ground yesterday for the new high school that is now under construction. While no official deadline has been set, the project is anticipated to take two years to complete. Some of the highlights of the new building include a 500 seat auditorium, a bandroom, about 68,000 square feet of new instructional space and offices for administration. The gymnasium, concourse, fitness center and dining areas will be renovated but will remain in their current space. The cost of the project is expected to be about \$26 million. The general contractor, Redlee Construction and Development, has already started groundwork in preparation of construction. The first phase will be to construct the new administrative offices and classroom wings. Attending the groundbreaking were Green County School Board members, architectural firm representatives, members of the school administration and staff, local and state government leaders along with several supportive community members. Parrott presented NAIA Individual Championship ring

On September 30, at halftime of the Campbellsville University Fighting Tiger home football game, Gracie Parrott received her ring for her performance at the NAIA Individual National Championship earlier this year.

Campbellsville

University's Gracie Parrott won the NAIA Individual National Championship at Rose Creek Golf Course in Oklahoma City, Okla. back in May after trailing by two shots at the completion of the third round.

Parrott finished the four-round tournament at 287 (-1). Parrott's 287 came after a first round 69 (-3), second round 73 (+1),

third round 75 (+3) combined with the final round 70 to finish as the only player under par for the tournament.

With the title, Parrott became the first ever NAIA Individual National Champion in golf on either the men's or women's side in the history of Campbellsville University.
