Eric Pruitt snagged this 13 pointer that scored 167 3/4" in North Central Missouri on private land Nov. 17 with a .270.

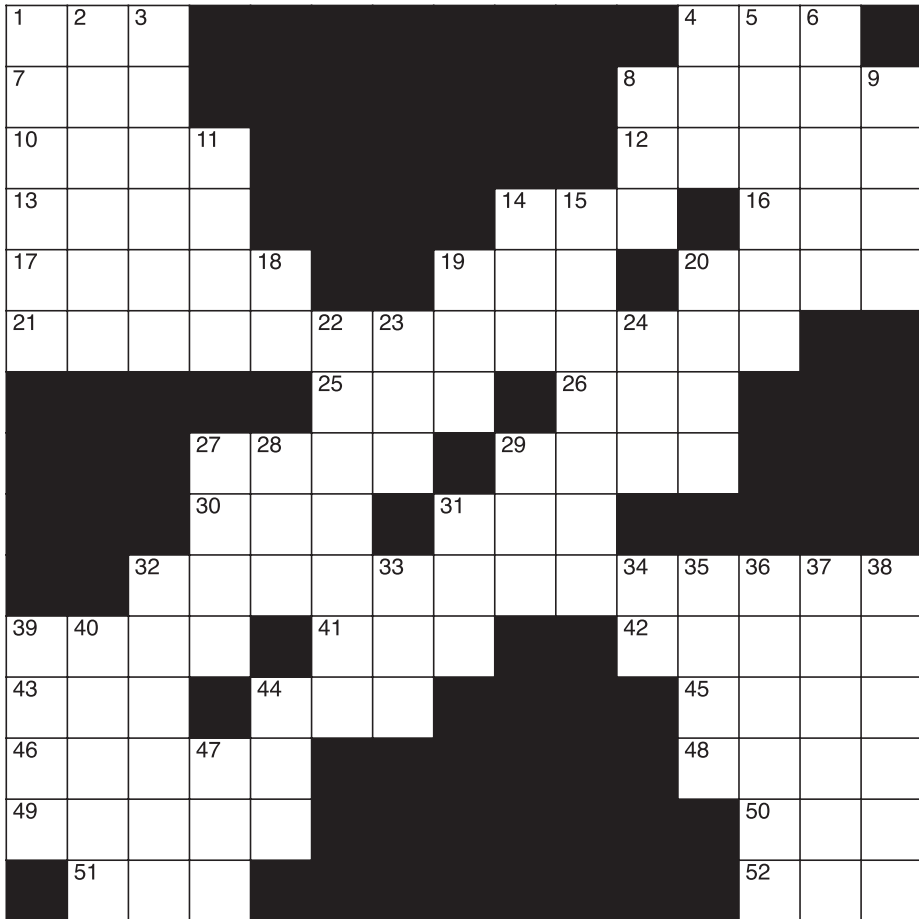


Eric Pruitt killed this Velvet 9 pointer that scored 132 inches. The buck was killed on the family farm in Exie on Sept. 11 during archery season.
