High School seniors are eligible to take postsecondary courses as dual enrollment students. Admission is based on State and professional requirements. MTC may assess each student's ability to benefit from specific programs through placement tests and counseling, and if necessary, will provide services or referrals to better prepare students for successful participation. The follow programs are offered at MTC: Business Management, Construction, Health Sciences, Human Services, Hospitality, Information Technology, Manufacturing, Public safety, & Transportation & Logistics.
