Please Remind Your Children To Be Aware of Strangers

One victim trusted a stranger who pretended to want to help her runaway, but he ultimately molested the young girl. Fortunately, MCSO able to apprehend this predator and bring justice to the victim.

On April 5, 2021, 43-year-old Edson Eduardo Fonseca Conde approached the victim and allowed her to use his cellphone. He then told the victim to get in his car and he would help her runaway. Fonseca Conde then took the victim back to his home, located at 14080 SE 59th Court in Summerfield, at which time he took her into a camper on the property, began asking her disturbing questions, and encouraged the victim to hide in the back bedroom. Once inside the bedroom, Fonseca Conde molested the victim and attempted to remove her clothing, but fortunately she was able to stop him. Eventually, the victim was able to run away from Fonseca Conde, still having his cellphone in her possession. She returned home and notified her mother about the incident, who contacted law enforcement.

Fonseca Conde was arrested on June 4 and has been released on \$10,000 bond. He is due back in court on July 6.



Marion County Voluntary Burn Ban Extended

The countywide voluntary burn ban in effect for Marion County has been extended due to the lack of rain and high wildfire danger. The voluntary ban affects all of Marion County.

The voluntary burn ban urges residents to cease all outdoor burning that has not been specifically permitted by the Florida Forest Service, as well as the use of any fireworks, sparklers, flares, or other pyrotechnic devices except for permitted public displays. Campfires may be permitted within designated recreational areas only, pursuant to applicable regulations and guidelines.

"The Wildland Task Force has extended the Voluntary Burn Ban due to the lack of significant rainfall. We are anticipating precipitation over the next five to six days which should reduce our wildfire danger," stated Marion County Fire Rescue Deputy Chief Bart Walker. "We are urging our community to comply with this voluntary ban."

Homeowners can reduce the risk of damage from wildfires by clearing the area around their homes of underbrush or dry plants/vegetation as these items create fuel for wildfires. It is also important to ensure that roofs and gutters are clear of trees and debris.
