## Auditor's office arrests former Pearl River **County Crimestoppers** board member

#### **Press Release**

On Monday, January 11, State Auditor Shad White announced Special Agents from his office have arrested Michelle McBride, a former board member and officer of the Pearl River County Crimestoppers (PRCCS), after she was indicted for embezzlement. An \$82,416.37 demand letter was issued to McBride when she was arrested.

McBride allegedly used her position as Secretary/ Treasurer to embezzle over \$52,000 from PRCCS from January 2014 to April 2019. Investigators believe Mc-Bride used the PRCCS debit card for personal rodeo expenses and transferred

PRCCS funds to fraudulent non-profit accounts she owned. Pearl River County Sheriff's deputies assisted in the investigation.

McBride surrendered to Special Agents at the Pearl River County Sheriff's office. Her bond was set at \$20,000 by the court.

If convicted, McBride faces up to 25 years in prison and \$15,000 in fines. All persons arrested by the Mississippi Office of the State Auditor are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law. The case will be prosecuted by the office of Dis-

No surety bond covers McBride's employment with the Pearl River County Crimestoppers. Surety bonds are similar to insurance designed to protect taxpayers from corruption. McBride will remain liable for the full amount of the demand in addition to criminal proceedings.
