for Saturday with limited spectators**

Holmes County 4-H youth will exhibit over 100 head of livestock this weekend at the Livestock Barn on Jaycee Drive in Lexington. Beef Cattle, Meat Goats, Sheep and Swine will be shown by 38 4-H youth.

COVID - 19 livestock show protocols will be in place. Exhibitors and visitors will be asked to wear masks, as well as, stay socially distanced. Regrettably, there will be no Pee Wee Showmanship as has been our biggest entertainment draw in the past, and, if numbers demand, class sizes will be reduced to eliminate crowding in the showing.

Show starts at 9:30 a.m. Saturday with Beef Cattle to be followed by Meat Goats, Sheep and Swine Show to start at 11 a.m. Judging will be by Karl Winge from Calhoun County, Texas.

These youth work have worked hard to get to this point with their animals, it is only fitting and proper to see them show first at our local show and support them as they go forward to the District next week, then, on to the Dixie National in Jackson to complete their "show year."
