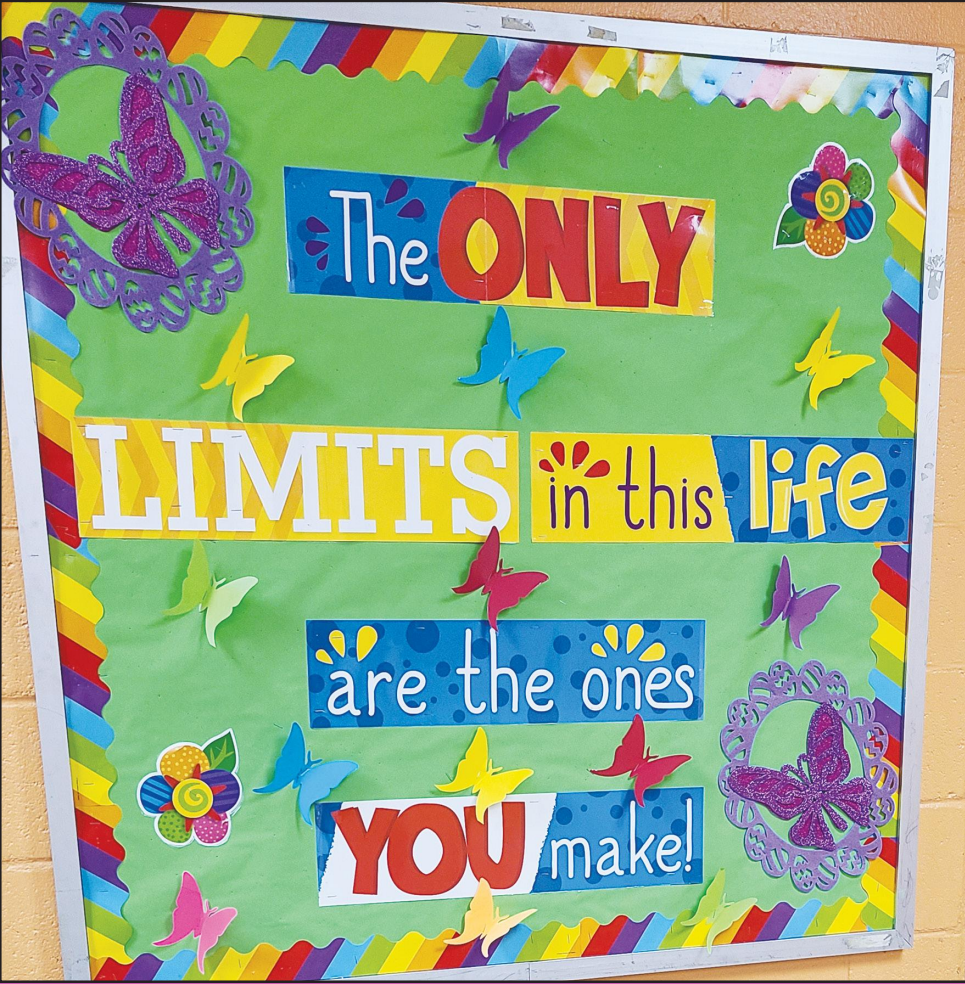


Springing into Action at William Dean Jr. Elementary

MedStat EMS, the ambulance service that serves Holmes County, is placing an ambulance in Tchula at the newly built fire station. MedStat contracts with Holmes County to provide ambulance service to the county. However, the ambulance being placed in Tchula is not part of the subsidy that the county provides.
