almost all of today's parents believe in magic words. They do so because the mental health professional community has for fifty years or so told them that children can be reasoned with, a claim that exposes the general lack of intellectual rigor in the mental health professions.

Magic words are words parents believe will magically change a child's attitude or behavior. Parents who believe in magic words are often found explaining to their kids why certain behavior is hurtful, counterproductive, irresponsible, or just plain wrong (albeit they try not to use that word lest it precipitate a psychological apocalypse). In these oneway magic word sessions, said parents are searching for words that will fill their children's brains with enlightenment. When enlightenment does not occur – as evidence by relapse of the attitude or behavior in question - said do so.


