(Continued from page 1.) When asked about a timeline for completion, Mayor McCrory said that there are many factors that will affect the replacement or repair. However, she stated that the completion of the bridge should take between 18 months and 2 years. In addition to acquiring a funding source, whether the bridge is repaired or replaced, it has to undergo rigorous state and engineering requirements. All of these obstacles will affect the timeline of completion.

Staff from the NRCS will work with producers one-on-one to develop a conservation plan based on the producer's goals, needs, and vision for their property, as well as help with the implementation of the practice selected by the landowner. The goal of these plans is to incorporate practices that will both benefit the environment and boost productivity and efficiency of agricultural and/or forestry production systems.
