Clinton History Week, held March 7-13, included a tour of the original Sumner Hill School, now located on the grounds of the Clinton Community Nature Center.

Dr. Prentiss Cox presented information about the site where the original Sumner Hill School once stood. He gave a history lecture and walked attendees around to see things like beds of daffodils that were planted near the school, which still bloom every year. He also explained that the round brick structure found on the Nature Center grounds is part of a cistern created next to the old school building, from which they obtained water.
