

Waynesville Tigers battle state ranked Kickapoo

Springfield, MO. Kickapoo High School February 12, 2021 – The Waynesville Tigers were defeated by the Kickapoo Chiefs in Ozark Conference action, 59-45.

Records: Waynesville 9-10 overall, 2-3 conference; Kickapoo 16-2 overall, 5-0 conference.

Waynesville trailed Kickapoo 17-9 after the first quarter. Waynesville won the second quarter 14-11 and trailed at the half, 28-23. Waynesville won the 3rd quarter 8-7. Kickapoo outscored Waynesville 20-14 in the fourth quarter. WHS

Tigers tied the game midway through the 3rd but could never take the lead. WHS trailed by 5 late in fourth before Kickapoo # 2 Liggins nailed a corner 3. Waynesville was unable to score on their final 3 possessions and Kickapoo drained 4 free throws and a late layup for the final score, 59-45

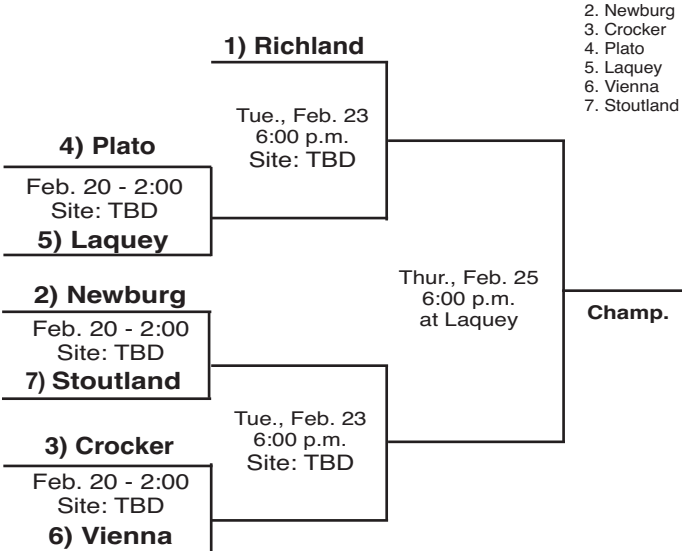

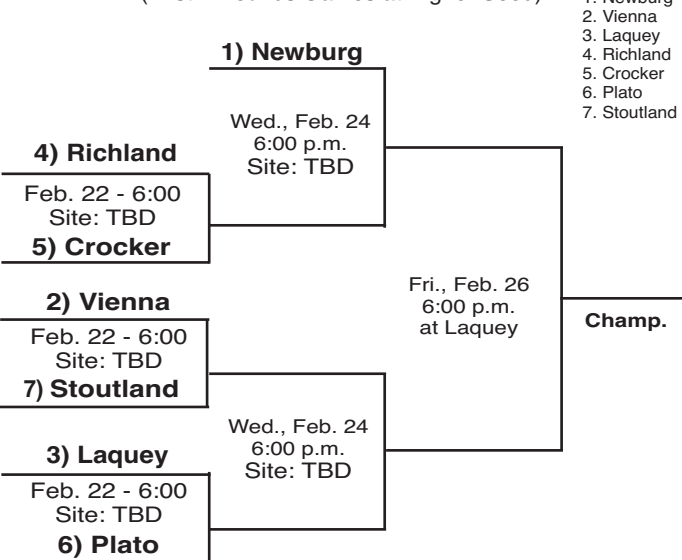

Waynesville trailed Rolla 13-8 after the first quarter. Waynesville and Rolla were tied 25-25 at the half. Waynesville won the 3rd quarter 13-7. Rolla outscored Waynesville 32-26 in the fourth quarter. The Tigers led by 12 with 2:55 left in the fourth and Rolla rallied to take a 1 point lead before Waynesville senior Gabe Rush hit a 3 with :15 seconds to put the Tigers up by 2 points, 64-62. Danny Foster hit a leaner in the paint for the Rolla Bulldogs to force overtime. Rolla won the OT period 10-7.
