Vs 9-12 The women remembered and went to tell the 11 remaining disciples that Jesus lives. They could not believe. Peter ran to the tomb and he saw the linen clothes remaining. He marveled at what happened. Peter is now a witness to this miracle. The gospel must be believed unto salvation. All of us are sinners and have fallen short of the glory of God. We all deserve punishment in Hell and apart from Jesus. Jesus came to redeem everyone from their sins through His death and res-
