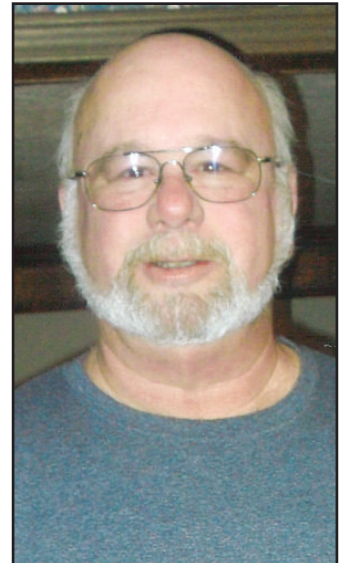

arising in Matthew 27. There is a correlation to the great judgment in Revelations and to Genesis 3 and verse 21 of the Psalm.
