Sarah Mulcahy, a life long resident of the Barnesville community, chose to use her nursing experience to help out at a neighboring facility during the covid crisis.

Mulcahy works as a Registered Nurse at the Fargo Veterans Administration (VA). She has been employed as a nurse in various capacities since graduating from Jamestown College in 1997.

As a care manager in the outpatient Mental Health clinic she had not given direct care for identified covid patients during most of 2020.

"A majority of our appointments were changed to virtual or phone," said Mulcahy. "The workload increased as did the mental acuity of patients that we were trying to

"In the midst of the social isolation and closures, our patients, like many, struggled with their mental health. We prioritized our work, worked hard and did what we could get done in a days time. Most importantly, we were there to help our Veterans through some of the darkest, most difficult days," continued Mulcahy.

In November, 2020 all of that changed for Mulcahy. She was faced with a decision to put herself in possible harm's way in order to help patients and others in the medical field.

Just before Thanksgiving, an email came out on a Friday morning to the VA nurses requesting assistance at Fargo's sister hospital in St. Cloud, MN.

Nurses were asked to leave for

a brief deployment the following Sunday

"I felt a strong obligation of duty to 'do more'," stated Mulcahy. "I called my husband, Pat, and shared that I wanted to help out in any way I could, and made the decision to go.

"I didn't know exactly what I was walking into, but I knew that I wanted to help and share the burden that those nurses felt. I walked onto the unfamiliar unit to care for unfamiliar patients. I used skills that I had not in many years.

"I leaned on nurses when I needed to. I felt anxiety and worry, and even doubt on some days. I smiled, I cried and I held many hands.

"I was there to see Veterans recover from covid and I was with them when they passed. I left there knowing that I made a difference

and I did my absolute best nursing,' continued Mulcahy.

Sarah Mulcahy and her husband, Patrick, celebrated their 25th wedding anniversary in December, 2020. "We have four wonderful daughters that we adore," said Sarah.

Grace is a junior nursing student at Jamestown University. Nicole is a sophomore at Moorhead State working on her early childhood education degree. Ashlyn is a senior and Elisabeth is a freshman at Barnesville High School.

"In March when the virus starting spreading, our family was like all others, cautious and mask wearing," stated Mulcahy. "Our children are older and they quickly adapted to the new school and social expectations without much challenge. We just stayed home and spent quality time together. Our circle was small, but it was okay."

Sarah was humbled and touched when one of the nurse assistants presented a poem that he had written on the Fargo nurses the last day at St. Cloud. The nurse assistant didn't know what else to share so he gave of himself and wrote the attached poem
