Sports and coaching is not new to Lyngaas. Basketball and baseball were his two favorite sports while growing up in Detroit Lakes. He played both sports through his senior year at DL, and started coaching his sophomore year at Concordia.

"I was a varsity assistant coach for the Moorhead boys basketball team for three seasons and just finished my first year as an assistant coach for the men's basketball team at Concordia College," Lyngaas said. "I spent one summer coaching Babe Ruth baseball and speed and strength in Hawley.

"Everything I did growing up involved sports and competition. I love being a part of a team that is unselfish, sets high goals, works hard to achieve them, and loves to compete every day in practice and games. As a coach in Hawley, I feel fortunate to get to know so many high character student-athletes and help them achieve their goals.

The Lady Nuggets have three seniors this year, Addi Dauner, Abby Rux, and Andreanna Sander. Addi and Abby have been playing varsity softball consistently since they were in 8th grade. The two are tremendous leaders and work hard all year around to improve in all areas of the game.

"Abby will be our ace this year in the pitcher's circle," Lyngaas said. "The lefty can throw multiple pitches for strikes and overpower hitters with her speed. Addi will do the majority of the catching for Abby and junior Elle Hastings. Addi's experience behind the plate is extremely valuable. She's a great athlete

Dauner, Hastings, and Fleming led us in hitting. Rux and Hastings threw the majority of the innings and both had an ERA around 1.00. The players and coaches appreciated the opportunity to be together as a team and compete against other towns."

When asked what it will take for the Nuggets to be a force in the HOL again this season, Coach Lyngaas said, "With the experience we return this season, I think our team has a lot of potential and I believe we can compete in every game. We have to be willing to come to practice everyday with the mindset that we need to improve, challenge each other, and hold each other accountable. We return a lot of players in our program that are ready to take the next step as leaders and softball players. Our biggest area to improve in is hitting consistently. We need contributions from everyone in our lineup if we want to compete in our section. If we can have

multiple players throughout the lineup able to get on base and advance runners, I think we can be tough to play against."

In the HOL this season, the Nuggets will be a team to beat as well as the team from DGF, which gave the Nuggets their only loss from the summer of 2020.

"Our players are really excited to actually have their season this year," Lyngaas concluded. "We

have a lot of experience returning, so the players are excited to work hard and compete at practice each day. With Covid and the weather, games and practices are going to be postponed/canceled throughout the spring. We're going to be grateful for every practice and game that we have. We were fortunate that Mother Nature cooperated, except for the recent rain and snow, and allowed us to have our first practice of the season outside."
